U.S. Army All-American Bowl Nominates PCTI's Carter Warren for 2017 U.S. Army All-American Bowl

Those nominated may be selected to showcase their talents on Saturday, January 7, 2017 in the annual East vs. West match-up televised live on NBC at 1:00PM EST.

The next step for the nominees occurs in September, when the U.S. Army All-American Bowl Selection Tour begins. Player finalists along with U.S. Army All-American Marching Band musicians will be announced nationwide throughout the fall, with the Selection Tour ending in early December.

For 17 years, the U.S. Army All-American Bowl has been the nation's premier high school All-American game, serving as the preeminent launching pad for America's future college and NFL stars. Andrew Luck, Odell Beckham Jr., Jamaal Charles, Christian McCaffrey and Derrick Henry made their national debuts as U.S. Army All-Americans, along with many others. A total of 25 U.S. Army All-American Bowl alumni were drafted in the 2015 NFL Draft and more than 300 have played in the NFL. The 2016 U.S. Army All-American Bowl drew a crowd of 39,121 at San Antonio's Alamodome.
